## **Description of Courses Taught**

## Ballet I DAA 2200c

Ballet I is an introduction to the fundamentals of Classical Ballet and serves to develop an understanding of basic ballet technique, terminology and history. Ballet class will increase body awareness and alignment throughout the barre work, center floor, and across the floor combinations. This course should give the student an appreciation of dance as an art form while learning the basic elements of movement consisting of: control, balance, time, direction and coordination.

#### Ballet II DAA 2201c

Ballet II is a continuation of Ballet I with more advanced barre work, center floor and across the floor combinations. This course has a required concert critique, therefore the dancers will be able to write a paper using correct terminology and recognition of fundamental ballet steps.

#### Ballet III DAA 3208c

Ballet III is designed for the dance minor program. It is by audition or teacher permission only in order to be able participate in this course. It is an advanced level of ballet and pointe work. Dancers will learn the elements of performance and choreography while doing practical class work. Terminology and advanced technical development is expected from the dancers.

## Tap I DAA2520c

Tap I is an introduction to the fundamentals of tap dance. It is a progressive step-by-step method of learning the basic elements of tap technique, combinations, and routines, while also learning rhythm, direction, and coordination. Student will learn basic tap terminology and the recognition of fundamental tap steps.

## Tap II DAA 2521c

Tap II is a continuation of Tap I with additional elements of technique, rhythmic sounds, and combinations. All this will be assembled together for a class routine.

## Tap III DAA 3524c

Tap III is an advanced technique of tap dance with a progressive step-by-step method of learning the additional elements of tap. This course also provides a historical look at tap through its contributors and heritages through video and film to deepen the appreciation of the art form.

#### Jazz I DAA 2570c

Jazz I is an introduction of the basic movements of American jazz dance, including practical class work, terminology and jazz dance history. Students will learn the basic elements of jazz movement that consist of control, balance, time, direction, and coordination through dance combinations, choreography, and performance.

### Jazz II DAA 2571c

Jazz II is a continuation of Jazz I with additional elements of movement consisting of flexibility, endurance, and conditioning. Students will learn through choreography and performance, with an additional emphasis placed on popular choreographic styles. The rapid pace in which the dance combinations are taught will prepare the student for today's fast-paced auditions.

## Jazz III DAA 3502c

Jazz III is designed for the dance minor program. This course is of a professional, conservatory nature. Student will learn expressiveness, motivation, musicality, and communication within the art of dance while doing practical class work on an advanced technical level through choreography and performance. This course will concentrate on leaps and turns.

## **Dance Improvisation/Composition I DAA 3612c**

Dance Improvisation/Composition I is the study and application of the basic principles of dance composition as it relates to concert dance. The course includes daily movement/improvisation sessions (non-choreographed movements) and several choreographic study assignments. Students will keep an extensive journal that is based on these sessions and assignments, classroom discussions and the mid-term and final project. Several choreographers and/or choreography from the final projects are chosen for the Annual UCF Dance Concert.

#### **Dance Studio DAA 30041**

Dance Studio is a lab course for the intermediate level dancer where the student will explore a broad range of dance styles and techniques on a "drop-in" basis. Student attends a minimum of five (5) dance classes during the semester not included in their regular course of study. These dance styles and technique classes include ballet, tap, jazz, and modern.

## **Choreography Practicum DAA 3645**

Choreography Practicum is a student's practice in choreographing a concert dance work for a public performance. Student will experience working with designers and dancers, participate in the concert dance audition, selection of dancers, rehearsals, concert showings of choreography, technical rehearsals and a final performance. The process of this new dance work is created for the UCF Annual Dance Concert.

### **Dance Performance DAA 3684**

Dance Performance is student's participation in a concert dance work. Student will work with choreographers for a public performance of the UCF Annual Dance Concert. Student will participate in the process of rehearsals, concert showings, technical rehearsals, costume fittings and a final performance.
