TEACHING EXPERIENCE

University of Central Florida, Orlando, FL

Assistant Professor in Theatre Acting, (2022 - present)

Acting Studio II: An exploration of theatre of the absurd and anti-realistic playwrights from early 20th century to present day. Students present group research projects creating comprehensive audio-visual presentations on the topics of: symbolism, expressionism, and epic theatre. In-depth written script analysis is paired with the acting methodologies of Konstantin Stanislavski and Uta Hagen.

<u>Undergraduate</u>

Acting II: Fundamental acting techniques with a focus on text analysis and the foundations of scene study. Emphasis is on the creation of tactics, intentions, and objectives, exploring improvisation, and the methodologies of Stanislavski and Hagen.

Acting III: Students in this advanced acting course develop a working knowledge of character development, script analysis, and a process for theatrical rehearsal. A deeper understanding of objective, obstacle, and action are reached using exercises drawn from Uta Hagen and Konstanin Stanislavski. Students are also required to lead a group discussion on assigned core principles of acting.

Musical Theatre Auditioning: This upper-level course requires musical theatre majors to prepare and perform appropriate material for a wide array of mock auditions. Core topics are covered ranging from acting through song to resume and repertoire preparation to agent meetings using professional, real world scenarios.

Theatre Survey for Majors: Chosen to create this online course to give a base-line knowledge of both the UCF Theatre Department and the theatre industry as a whole. This Gordon Rule Writing course requires written critiques of live theatrical performances and rehearsals, with special focus on terminology, theatrical elements, and departmental standards and practices.

Acting for Non-Majors: A beginning-level course in which students become acquainted with the fundamentals of acting. Emphasis is on self-confidence, freedom of movement, and collaborating with fellow actors.

Intermediate Acting: Building on Acting for Non-Majors, this integrates Uta Hagen's methodologies with an emphasis on scene study and the implementation of tactics, intentions, and objectives. Primary concepts include listening, relationship, and backstory.

Theatre Careers: Online, upper-level course for Entertainment Management or B.A. Theatre majors focuses on the different roles within the theatrical entertainment fields. Special attention is paid to resume analysis, interview skills, freelance work, and personal financial planning.

Honors Theatre Survey: An overview of both the fundamentals of theatre history and the composition of a theatrical work. This Gordon Rule Writing course assesses live and recorded theatrical productions with required peer-reviews of fellow student's work. Topics are explored in written, audio-visual, and experiential applications.

Theatre Survey: This asynchronous, Gordon Rule Writing course provides an introduction to theatre history and the elements that comprise a theatrical production. Special attention is paid to design elements, acting and directing observations, and the evaluation of recorded live theatrical performances.

Independent Study

Practice in Uta Hagen: In-depth exploration of self-observation with Uta Hagen's ten exercises. Implementing the methodology of "Scoring the Role" as both a writing assignment and as it applies to scene work and character development.

Musical Theatre Auditioning: Advanced acting course for juniors and seniors with a focus on applied acting techniques through scene work, improvisational character movement, and acting through song.

Acting Intensive (2014 - 2016): Instructing NKU students over the years through guest speaking, a business of theatre forum, and a week long intensive covering dramatic scene work, acting through song, audition preparation, and ending with mock auditions complete with a call back experience.
